Election Report



A Message from Abe Hamadeh

A recent analysis of uncounted provisional ballots from the November 2022 Attorney General race between Democrat Kris Mayes and Republican Abe Hamadeh in could reverse the outcome of the race. The margin between Kris Mays and Abe Hamadeh is a narrow 280 votes. In the November 2022 Election, day of votes were 2 to 1 Republican. Abe Hamadeh led on day-of voters statewide, winning an average of 70 percent of the votes. Theoretically, any contested provisional or mail-in ballots may result in the first race overturned in nearly a century. Abe Hamadeh: "We have more votes than Kris Mayes. It's up to the courts to decide to count them."

Legal Update

Abe Hamadeh is challenging the outcome of the election in court. Last week, the Mohave County Superior Court <u>scheduled</u> <u>oral arguments</u> for Hamadeh's Motion for a New Trial. Hamadeh filed a Motion for New Trial after discovering new voter discrepancies in Pinal County. Oral arguments will take place on May 16. The fate of a new trial now rests in the hands of the judges on whether they will grant the motion for a new trial. According to AZ Free News, Abe Hamadeh's legal team has over 250 affidavits from allegedly disenfranchised voters.

Breakdown

- There is a 280-vote gap between Abe Hamadeh and Kris Mayes.
- 8,000 provisional ballots are still outstanding.
- Abe Hamadeh won over 70 percent of the vote on Election Day.
- In the November 2022 election, there were more provisional ballots cast and higher rejection rates last year than in 2020.
- This would not be the first time in Arizona's history that an election was overturned. In 1916, the Gubernatorial governor's race was overturned even after the Maricopa County Superior Court and a Democratic Secretary of State had declared a winner.
