# LADIES AND GENTLEMEN, WE HAVE A BUDGET!

A fter months of negotiations, we were able to pass a budget for the state of Arizona! When Governor Hobbs came into office, she demanded funding for abortion clinics, defunding the border strike force, defunding ESA's, and funding illegal immigrants to attend universities. I'm proud to say, she didn't receive a single one of those socialist asks in the budget. Instead, we pushed back and did the exact opposite. We increased ESA's by \$400 million dollars. We funded our local border law enforcement agencies with \$40 million dollars. We invested \$600 million dollars into our roads and bridges. We invested \$133 million dollars into water preservation projects. And we provided a \$250 million dollar tax rebate to Arizona families. In other words, we passed a Republican friendly budget while Governor Hobbs and the Democrats stood by asking what just happened to them. This is what happens when you have strong leaders representing you down at the Capitol!

Furthermore, with the passing of SCR1037, we just did something that might just save our elections. Senator Borrelli sponsored SCR1037, a Senate concurrent resolution that just gave power back to the legislature when it comes to our elections. The resolution simply states that the legislature is exercising our plenary authority to see that no electronic voting systems in the state of Arizona are used as the primary method for conducting, counting, tabulating, or verifying federal elections unless those systems meet necessary standards of protection. So if the machines do not meet the standards of protection set forth by Homeland Security, they can't be used as a primary method to count votes. It's time we go back to hand counts!

# WHAT DID WE GET DONE FOR DISTRICT 30?

Year after year, we continue to fight for rural Arizona. This year was no different. Here are the amazing items we secured funding for in this years budget:

- 1. \$8 million for turn lanes on Highway 95 in Bullhead City
- 2. \$9 million for Mohave County Sheriff to build/remodel 4 substations( Lake Havasu, Beaver Dam, Mohave Valley, and the boat safety center on the Colorado River)
- 3. \$3.4 million for the Kingman wash recharge basin
- 4. \$35 million for the 2nd bridge in Lake Havasu
- 5. \$900k for the La Paz County Sheriff Department Dispatch Center
- 6. \$1.4 million for Wickenburg Fire
- 7. \$500k for Mohave County Sheriff Mobile Command Center
- 8. \$5 million for the State Lake Improvement Fund



# School Board Committee

Il attendees gave a brief review of their background and motivation for joining the committee. David Diaz volunteered to be Vice Chair of the committee.

We discussed school board election's history in Mohave County. Current School Board make up and upcoming vacancies. Barbara Carpenter volunteered to facilitate an Excel spreadsheet to include Mohave County School Board members and their political affiliation. Barbara facilitated and provided the Excel spreadsheet to the committee board members on Friday May 5. The political affiliation of the various School Board Superintendents, along with other pertinent information, will be provided when available. Barbara provided this to the. Committee on Friday May 5, as well as website addresses for the various Mohave County School Boards.

We will vet all School Board members in the upcoming elections and make sure all GOP confirmed candidates are 100% with candidate petition signature requirements. David Diaz will provide laptop Zoom capabilities for future Committee meetings (mtg venue permitting).

MCRCC PC teams will be asked to attend local School Board meetings when able. Feedback from attendance at these meetings will be crucial as we game plan to ensure Mohave County School Boards are transparent with agendas and school curriculum plans. We will verify the current situation of Representative John Gillette's School Curriculum bill #HB 2533. This bill mandates that all Arizona School Districts have their lesson plans available online. This bill passed in the legislature and as typical, was vetoed by Governor Hobbs.

We will also verify that no Mohave County School Districts are utilizing equity-based grading systems. We believe that each student should be graded on their own individual effort and accomplishment.

It was decided that the School Board Committee will meet 1X monthly at this time.

Our next meeting will be the first Wednesday of the month. June 7, 2023. Future MCRCC School Board Committee meetings will be held at the Mohave County Library, Lake Havasu City branch in the Conference Room. Meeting time to be 4PM to 5:45PM.



-The Candidate Research Committee chairperson will present to the MCRCC Executive Board the final candidate suggestions immediately after the Primary Election.

- If agreed through a vote, the MCRCC Executive Board will have the MCRCC Treasurer send donations

This committee will be a year round commitment. Mohave County is very much admired throughout the state right now, this success is due to our hard work on election outcome, money making and our strong unity. It is very exciting to be recognized as the only county that donates to candidates outside their county lines. 
